

Second: Remember, put the festival on your calendars: May 10, 11, 12. We need help. Please signup.

Third: No 6:00 p.m. Mass on 1st Friday, May 4th. I have the Race for Vocations Mass in Indy that night.

Fourth: You have probably heard of the new feature on the St. Joseph website (stjoeshelby.org) where people can ask Deacon Tom or me a question. We have already had 15 questions....which is great. In general, Deacon Tom or I will answer one per week here in the bulletin. However, I want to play a little catch up! This is an ongoing feature. As I was told as a kid, "there is no such thing as a dumb question." If you have a question, chances are someone else has the same question.

Ask Fr. Mike

Q: How can I arrange to have my newborn baptized? What is the prep process? Cristi D.

A: It's never been easier! To arrange a baptism at St. Joe, just call the office (317-398-8227) or my cell phone (812-391-0047). Or, better, you can go to the St. Joe website and click on b the Sacraments tab under Worship with Us. There you can fill out a form online with all the info we need. I will reach out to you. As Church Law suggests (Canon 852 §1), it is best for the pastor to visit and bless the house of the child to be baptized. In the house, I give a baptism lesson and we establish a date and time for the baptism. (When I visit your home, I always enjoy a cookie and coffee:)) I am happy to do baptisms during Mass, before Mass, or whenever is best for the family. Remember that Dn. Tom also does baptisms.

Q: Why did you waste money on the school bus when we have so many bigger problems around here that need fixed? *Anonymous*

A: My dear friend! First, the school bus came at a wonderful price and I was happy to donate it to the parish myself. Second, please keep a happy attitude. Our bus has been used many times—for field trips, caroling to our shut-ins, spiritual pilgrimages for our whole parish, and A: all kinds of other times. I just used it last week, matter of fact. For some reason, I love driving the thing. (Side note: Shelby Central Schools has been so kind in helping us keep it tuned up. I am deeply thankful!) But, to your larger question: the "bigger problems" you speak of will be addressed in time. You can trust that we are good stewards of the gifts we receive. I'm sorry if I've ever given the impression otherwise.

A: Celebrate Holy Mass. It is the best.

St. Joseph 150th History Beauty of Stained Glass

Windows Preserved

Preserving the beauty of the

stained glass windows at St. Joseph Catholic Church, just like maintenance of anything, has occurred consistently throughout the decades. Damaged glass has been replaced, cracks in the panes have been sealed, loose lead removed, nameplates repaired or replaced with new ones, weather-proofing on the outsides of the windows done, and of course, cleaning.

A letter written by Rev. Edward McLaughlin, dated May 7, 1977, explained accidents that brought about the need for repair of stained glass windows. "Dear Sir: We wish to report two (or 3) broken Church stained glass windows. The church window is on the eastside-facing north of Church. The two vent windows had 3 or 4 panels or pieces knocked out by hitting them to open the vent. I tried to get someone around here to repair it, but no one would do it. I contacted the Stained Glass Specialists from Evansville; they were in Shelbyville to install protective glass in the Christian Church. Enclosed is their estimate. They are in the process of being repaired; I had to pay \$130.00 before they would undertake the job. The latest happened about three weeks ago. The boys hit a ball through the stained glass window on back of Church. They broke one panel or piece. I can't get an estimate until the company comes to replace the other broken window."




