

Q. In your opinion, would a person go to hell for being gay? Anonymous

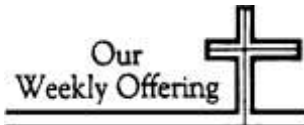

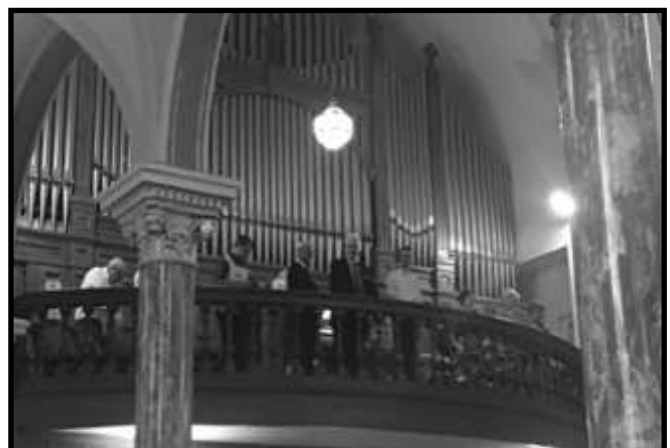
St. Joseph School Hair Donation Party
