Dear All,

Some updates—

1. **Archbishop Thompson**—Next weekend, the Archbishop will be with us for the 10:30 am Mass (June 3). We will also be joined by several former St. Joe priests. It will be a wonderful celebration. Dinner will follow after Mass at the K of C. Please come and celebrate our parish!!
2. **Corpus Christi Procession**—After the 5 pm Mass next weekend (June 2), we will have a Corpus Christi procession around the block. It will be wonderful. I hope everyone can come. It is a happy tradition of the Church to have a procession with the Holy Eucharist after Mass on Corpus Christi.
3. **Festival**—The festival was a great success. We made about \$25,000. The monies will be spent well, for St. Vincent de Paul, Youth, and to cover general operating expenses. Thanks for making our festival so great!
4. **New Principal**—Please see my note in this bulletin on page five.
5. **Gum**—In the last few weeks, I've seen a few people chewing gum at Mass. The volunteers cleaning the church last weekend found a whole bunch of gum under the pews. It was disgusting. Please make sure you do not have gum in your mouth at church, and that your kids and guests don't either. Can you imagine somebody chewing gum in a private audience with the Queen of England? Or Pope Francis? How disrespectful that would be. All the more so with the Lord. I am very concerned when people come up for communion with gum in their mouths. I have instructed all of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to kindly ask the person to take the gum out, but I hope we can avoid that having to take place if people simply dispose of their gum before church. 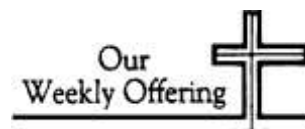

There is much work to be done. I have spoken with the Archdiocese about what our next steps should be and I'm not going to let the plan die. I've read through it enough to know that there are many great things in there. I can't wait to see what God will do here at St. Joe's in the coming years. We must all do our part.

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. Many of you may wonder, what are we celebrating anyway? Because, just like I used to teach my first graders, the Blessed Trinity is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three persons in One God. We pray to them every time we pray the sign of the Cross. The Blessed Trinity is a mystery! A mystery is something we can think about and think about (many times think about) and never understand. How does it affect my life?
