## Ask Fr. Mike

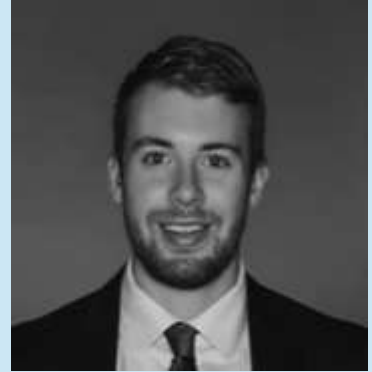
- Q. What is your favorite food? *Anna, age 4*

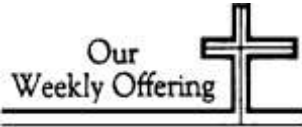

## Sr. Joan's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

We have celebrated Easter, the Seven weeks of Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Holy Trinity, and The Body and Blood of Christ. We are back to Ordinary Time in the Church calendar and the Priest will wear green vestments at Mass. In this week's Gospel Reading we hear Jesus say, "For whoever does the will of God is my brother, sister and mother." I thought about how this saying applies to my life. On Sunday morning, I know what God's will is for me. It is for me to get up, get the Church ready for all the people to come and to welcome them. And help celebrate Holy Mass together with the faithful. On other days, it is not so clear. I have many choices to make between good actions and what I might rather do.
