

From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

This Monday we celebrate Labor Day. We thank God for the gift of labor, the gift of work. Whenever we are overworked, stressed, and stretched thin, we might remember those in nursing homes who wish they could work. It is a human thing to want to be useful and it sure takes a toll on folks when they no longer can be as they once were. Remember how God gave Adam and Eve custody of the garden? Genesis 2:15 says, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it."

Speaking of gardens, my garden produced a lot of fruits this year. Lots of tomatoes and peppers and things. As I write this, I plan to make some salsa this week. We'll see how it turns out. I am not an expert.

First Friday—This coming Friday is First Friday. Please sign up for an hour. Adoration starts after morning Mass on Friday (about 9 am). There will be no 6 pm First Friday Mass, but I will have a Mass on Saturday morning at 8:30 am and I will pray the Mass in reparation for all the horrible crimes done by unfaithful and depraved priests.

Ask Fr. Mike

- Q. I'm very concerned about the book chosen for Dcn. Tom's next book study. It is by Fr. James Martin, a controversial priest who has said things that conflict with Church teaching especially about marriage. I am concerned.
- A. Thank you for your note. Fr. James Martin is a Jesuit priest who lives in New York. He is the editor of *America Magazine*, which the Jesuits put out. To start, I would say that I am also troubled by some of what he has said at various times in public settings. He has confused a lot of people. In particular, Fr. Martin sadly seems not to fully understand or support the Church's teaching on marriage—or the marital embrace—as being between a man and a woman. These truths are clearly outlined in the scriptures and in several places in the *Catechism*. For example: "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring" (CCC 1601).

That said, I have read and enjoyed a few books by Fr. Martin. I took his *Jesus A Pilgrimage* book with me to the Holy Land years ago and it was of great help. I've also read parts of *My Life With the Saints*, the book Dcn. Tom has chosen for this study. I do not think the book itself contains anything contrary to Church teaching and I think it will help many folks here come closer to the Lord this Fall. All are welcome to the book study! Please feel free to chat with Dcn. Tom as well.



Mental Illness

According to the National Institute of Health, in a given year about one in four people have a diagnosable mental disorder, such as depression, bi-polar disease, schizophrenia, among others. One in 17 people has a severe mental illness. Mental illness encompasses biological, psychological, social and spiritual dimensions of the individuals affected. The illness also impacts the lives of the person's family. Severe mental illness often raises profound questions of faith such as why does God allow sickness or why me? As a faith community we are called to support individuals and their families through their time of crisis when the illness first occurs and in the ensuing life with and ongoing recovery from it. The spiritual dimension is critical to the recovery process. We can offer spiritual comfort through our prayerful presence in people's lives by acknowledging their pain and supporting them through the healing and recovery process.

Second Reading — Religion that is pure is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction (James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27).


Gospel — This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me (Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23).




