## From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Bruce filled that big pothole and the two of them have worked so hard to make the cemetery look so nice. I also repeat my thanks for the ladies and gentlemen who sanded the fence and repainted that.

All this effort in the cemetery—but why?! Because the month of All Souls is about to begin! I love this month so much. We honor and pray for our deceased ancestors, so many faithful who have gone before us and live on but on a

different shore, and in a greater light, and are among that multitude which none can number, whose hope was in the Lord Jesus Christ, in whom we are forever one. Be sure to join one of our All Souls Masses. Also be sure to join us for the cemetery visits that we will have at SV and SJ. I'm going to find a time to celebrate Mass outside in the SJ cemetery. I'll let you know when.

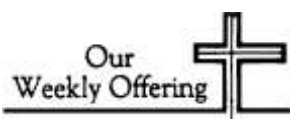

I often wonder what my Dad thought when he heard this Gospel reading. He was blind for most of his life. I'm sorry I never asked him. It may have led to a deep conversation. This Gospel is about more than physical blindness. We see that when Jesus heals blind people he gives them more than just physical sight; he opens their eyes so they can see more deeply. This week as we take time to pray, let's ask Jesus to help us see in a deeper way. By shifting our eyes from seeing through familiarity to seeing through wonder. By shifting our eyes from seeing through jealousy to seeing through admiration. Our eyesight is clear when we delight in admiration. By shifting our eyes from seeing through bitterness to seeing through eyes purified and softened by grief. Tears clear our eyesight because they soften a wounded heart. By shifting our eyes from seeing through anger to seeing through forgiveness. Nobody holding a grudge sees straight. By shifting our eyes from seeing through longing to seeing through gratitude. The most grateful person you know has the best eyesight of all the people you know. Seeing straight has more dimensions than we normally imagine.
